By utilizing the resources provided by the Career Center, your student will be better positioned to navigate the competitive job market and achieve their professional goals after graduation.




### Career Day Fall 2023

- □ Secure an internship in a field of interest, work part-time or volunteer over the summer in an area related to interests.
- Register for and take a one-hour Professional Development class offered by the Career Center.

#### **JUNIOR**

- □ Check out graduate school resources offered by the Career Center and begin prepping for entrance exams (if planning to attend graduate school).
- Pursue involvement, leadership and service opportunities through student organizations.
